






STRATEGIC HIGHLIGHTS

In 2022 and leading into 2023 there were significant changes to the School.

- A formal move from a Home-Based Curriculum to a National Curriculum was completed and we were able to roll it out across all year levels and all eight curriculum areas from the start of 2023, in live classes at home using "Learning@ Faith".
- A number of Teacher led clubs were started from Chess to Pedal Prix, Dog Training to a History Club
- A number of specialist teachers joined the School to include Japanese, Spanish,
 Outdoor Education and Music.
- We navigated the COVID 19 Mandates for students and staff.
- The quality of sporting events like Swimming, Cross Country and Athletics was lifted and we were able to invite members of the Homeschooling Community along as guests, some of whom joined our Distance Education School.
- We joined the Christian School Sports Association so we could have fellowship and compete with many Christian Schools around Queensland in 2022.
- We added a number of quality online programs and resources to enhance and add clarity for our families. These include:
 - Quarterly resource packs. From Prep to Year 6, each Term during the holidays, we post out the physical workbooks students need. These are the same as online interactive workbooks. Families can do their work online, or in paper books, and then upload the work to be assessed by their teachers who provide regular feedback and guidance.
 - Edvale, a timetabling program to add clarity and predictability of when live lessons are available. All these lessons are recorded for later reference or for families that have schedules that don't match lesson times due to other commitments.
 - Oliver is an online library program where families can search for and order a variety of books and other resources. Our Librarian also advises families and teachers on what is available with Faith and other providers.
 - Sentral is our family database that securely holds all the information we need to run our School. Parents can log on to their details as required.
 - Faith e-News provides a weekly news update and videos so families can stay up to date on all that is on offer at Faith.
- 2023 will be a full year for our School as we settle into new systems and our families learn how to enjoy the flexibility, choice and safety of our learning community.

DISTINCTIVE CURRICULUM OFFERINGS

Overview

- Differentiation is highly valued, reflecting the value and importance placed on each person's unique identity. The use of a UDL pedagogy establishes an inclusive approach into learning from the outset.
- We enjoy having a number of families who have significant experience in Home Education. In a Distance Education setting, they are well able to follow the Schools curriculum and use a variety of programs to supplement the School produced workbooks.
- Teaching is represented in a variety of formats to allow for heightened engagement through both meaningful access and opportunities to demonstrate learning at levels that are appropriate for the student and in the format that is most effective for them.
- Goal is to lead students to be self-actualising, self-directed independent learners. We use a
 GRR (Gradual Release of Responsibility) approach which is used developmentally across the
 year levels as well as within the construct of individual lessons.
- Building of community through the development of strong, appropriate relationships within the School and beyond.
- Community feedback is encouraged and informs revision for future development.

Senior Secondary

Faith Christian School of Distance Education has successfully provided Senior Secondary courses that prepare students for tertiary study, employment, and life opportunities. Our school subjects have, and continue to meet Queensland requirements of the Senior learning system. It has been encouraging over the last seven years to see a sample of students attain outstanding subject results and excellent university entrance ranks (e.g., OP 1-3).

At Faith Christian School of Distance Education, we desire to see all students achieve the best possible outcomes in terms of future study options and vocational choice. Senior students choose either an 'ATAR pathway' (Australian tertiary admissions rank), or a 'Non ATAR pathway' (students work toward gaining their QCE through an individual selection of school subjects and courses, or a combination of school subjects and courses alongside a school based traineeship/apprenticeship.

We provide students that choose an ATAR pathway with a quality, challenging academic program through a wide range of General subjects taught by subject specialist teachers. However, we have worked hard at Faith CSDE to provide a greater range of options, utilising both internal and external VET (Vocational Education and Training) courses to complement our QCAA Year 11 and 12 subjects for students that do not choose an ATAR pathway.

Our staff share a belief in the opportunity for every student who puts in the time and effort to experience success! We want to ensure our students gain quality support for positive learning experiences through:

- A range of QCAA Year 11 and 12 Subjects
- School-based (and external) VET courses e.g. Cert II and Cert III
- School-Based Traineeships/Apprenticeships
- Work Experience and Volunteering placements

- Outdoor Education experiences and even a Snowy Trip
- Missions Trips and Ministry
- University Head start-type courses

PLANNED CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Faith Christian School offers a wide range of co-curricular activities that provide learning opportunities outside the classroom. This adds value to the individual students by engaging them in activities with other students, provides differentiated learning pathways and give further opportunities for students to engage with others. Our Co-Curricular Options include:

- Sports Carnivals Swimming, Cross Country and Athletics
- Outdoor Education Camp programs
- The Duke of Edinburgh Program
- Scuba Diving Open Water Course
- Indoor Rock Climbing Session

Sports Carnivals

Various sports carnivals were held, both regional events and large scale SEQ events with large numbers attending these events. Events in the regions were open up to non faith families and provided opportunities to network and build relationships.

Outdoor Education Camps

Outdoor Education Camps provide opportunities to bring people together, explore the natural environment and challenge themselves across a diverse array of learning activities. In 2022 we offered regionally specific programs that catered to different age groups and explored many natural places. This inquiry based learning model enables students to reach their potential, choose the program that suits them and forms connection and friendship along the way. Faith Christian School delivered over 15 camp programs in 2022.


The Duke of Edinburgh Program

During 2022, we had over 25 students enrolled in the Duke of Edinburgh Award and we delivered 5 different adventurous journeys for these students. This included the Sunshine Coast Great Walk, Rock Climbing and Abseiling program in the Glass House Mountains, a Noosa bushwalking traverse program and a High country trip at the end of the year for gold level participants. We had 8 participants receive their bronze or silver level of the award. At the Year 12 Graduation ceremony, we gave 5 participants a commemorative paddle as a memento for the first participants to graduate Faith Christian School with this award.



Scuba Diving Open Water Course

In April, we had 8 students complete an open water scuba diving course on the Gold Coast. This involved classroom sessions, pool sessions and boat diving. An unforgettable experience for these, now qualified divers, to experience life underwater. Some of these students then helped at a Gold Coast SeaWay clean up dive where they removed rubbish from this environment, creating a cleaner world.



Indoor Rock-Climbing Sessions

Over the holiday periods, the SAS indoor rock wall was opened up to the School community so that students and parents could meet other students and challenge themselves at climbing. We had over 200 people attend these events where they met other families, socialised and helped to build community within the members. There were lots of smiles, physical recreation and fun times had as a community.

The Australian Curriculum is an inquiry based learning model that prioritises critical and creative thinking. Co-Curricular activities enable social interactions, exploration and holistic learning that develops individuals to become real world people who can deal with adversity, overcome challenges and function in this ever changing world. We develop students to not just be academically smart, but good communicators, students who know themselves and are driven to be the best they can be.

SOCIAL CLIMATE

During 2022 our social climate continued to be shaped by the relationships that developed between student and teacher, family and teacher, and interactions between our School families, and student peer groupings. Our families come from a wide range of geographical locations, situations, backgrounds and aspirations. Our regular Faith Christian School of Distance Education community events actively involved staff, parents, and students. Families came together from near and far, throughout the school year, for a range of School facilitated events. These events created opportunities for our families to widen their social circles, engage in curriculum focused activities, showcase student's interests and talents, and strengthen new and existing relationships. Our new online Chapel on Fridays was launched. "Faith Talks" developed into a time

for praise and worship, a variety of speakers and even students had the opportunity to present short talks. Students lead prayer meetings and bible studies under the watchful eye of teachers and our new Regional Student Representatives in Years 6 and 12 prepared to represent their School at community events like ANZAC services and Lions Youth of the Year.

Home Visits

Teachers and families alike looked forward to these regular visits. Despite the changing Covid restrictions our Area Teachers were able to schedule home visits throughout the year. These anticipated visits usually comprised of an educational activity and discussions around the work students were doing and/or had completed.

Workshops

Every Term the regional teams, guided by the Area Coordinators, prepared, and led regional workshops for students and parents. These well attended events included beginning of the year Meet and Greets, Music Workshops, Science Fairs, and a celebration of The Arts at the end of the year.

Sporting Events

Some of the regions across our Faith Christian School of Distance Education community conducted regular sporting activities for the local students and families. Lots of fun was had while various sporting skills were taught and practiced.

Co-Curricular Activities

During 2022 students from some of our regions had the opportunity to participate in activities that allowed them to explore new skills and/or develop their personal interests alongside of their peers. Regional dance and drama classes were well attended. All who were involved enjoyed having fun and socializing while learning and developing skills and talents.

Celebrations

At the end of the year Faith Christian School of Distance Education rolled out the red carpet and many functions were held across the state to bring teachers, students, and families together to celebrate the growth and achievements of our students. Every region held their own Awards Evenings each with their own special touches and showcasing of talents. The culminating event for our graduating Senior Students was very special. Families travelled great distances and donned their finest outfits to recognise our Year 12 students. This was one our finest social events and a wonderful way to close out the year.





FAITH FLEXIBLE LEARNING

Faith Flexible Learning experienced a few changes throughout the course of the 2022 year. The biggest shift was the increase in student numbers to 28, two away from max capacity. It was hard to adjust at first, with both teachers and students settling in slowly with the numbers, but it was well sorted moving into Term 2. Our students participated in a wide range of programs, in and outside of the School, including but not limited to; rock climbing, gymnastics, gym, mountain bike riding, hiking, adventure parks, and various art projects. Four of our students completed their Construction Cert I Course alongside finishing the requirements for their white cards. We had four students move on at the end of 2022, with two of them completing their short course competencies in literacy and numeracy. Students also participated in a range of activities for their Friday reward days, ranging from swimming in lagoons, aqua parks, forest treks, climbing Tambourine mountain, art shows and theatre, and Kingston Park Raceway. The student attendance rose as the year went on and the average rate of attendance for all students was around 60-70%. This was an incredible win!

In 2023 we will be looking to move into giving students a chance at studying six different subjects including Auslan for language and Design Technology, the latter focused on building a greenhouse where we can start producing our own food. It will be another tough but fulfilling year in 2023 and we look forward to seeing the social, emotional, and intellectual development of our students continue to grow.
