

Ministry Course Overview

Course Description



The Certificate III in Ministry Course is for every person wanting to grow in their spiritual walk and learn new skills in practical ministry. The foundational concepts of Christianity are taught and developed through various tasks such as debating, journaling, researching and discussions to help them discover answers to their questions and apply the Word of God to their own life.

This course will help students deepen their understanding of the Christian Faith and serve in a Christian church group or ministry context. Students will be given an overview of the Bible, develop an understanding of the foundations of Christianity, and have the opportunity to serve and gain experience in practical ministry in their local church or community care ministry. During the practical internship phase, students will learn ministry from the other side of the stage and experience first hand what is required to serve in a ministry.

Students will engage with the Word of God, developing an understanding of practical theology by applying scripture to everyday life, debating and questioning their understanding of the Bible and exploring how it applies to today's current topics. Students will learn the Biblical worldview of Grace, Sonship, the Fall, Christ as Lord and Saviour and how to identify the faults of secular philosophy and its consequences using current media. Students will also get to ask their questions in the "Discussing the Hard Questions" section of the Course.

Bible reading and the discipline of maintaining a reflective Journal will be central to each week. This course lays a foundation for every Christian and those asking questions and seeking answers. It will also be perfect preparation for future ministry training.

This course requires students to present on a regular basis and webcams and mics turned on are a must to satisfy industry standard requirements. Students receive a nationally recognised qualification and 8 points towards their QCE.

Key Activities

Term 1	Learning and understanding Christian foundation and theological themes, researching and debating theological themes, reading and journaling scripture, creating a Christ-Centered Life plan
Term 2	Presenting the Gospel, applying Biblical principles to current ethical issues, participating in local church or parachurch ministries
Term 3	Participating in Ethical debates, sharing the gospel, preaching, writing and presenting a small group lesson
Term 4	Reflecting on lessons learned

MANAGE ALL MODIFY

Interactive Learning Session



Students will connect online for interactive learning sessions for 1.5 hours on Tuesdays and Thursdays using a webcam, headset and microphone. During the session, students will be introduced to new ideas and information, collaborate with other students on how to apply that information in their context, have the practical task demonstrated, have the opportunity to ask questions and commence the practical task while receiving feedback from the trainer.

Students must attend these sessions and have no other external obligations at that time. Interactive training sessions cannot be completed by watching a video after hours. Just like in any workplace, Students in this Vocational Course must attend their interactive sessions consistently, participate in class discussions and work with their colleagues. Students who do not attend 80% of the interactive sessions may not be eligible to complete the Course.

Students must also do practical tasks for up to 2 hours each week. All evidence of the student completing a practical task must be uploaded to Learning@Faith

MANAGE ALL MODIFY

Essential Equipment

The student must be a currently enrolled student in Faith Christian School year 10, 11 or 12.

Students should set up a clear and quiet workspace with consideration of [Government working-from-home guidelines](#). To attend online interactive sessions students will need an environment free from distractions, and a computer with an Internet connection. The computer must include audio, a microphone and a webcam. This is very important and is part of your training in meeting the demands of the workplace for this industry.


You will be connecting to your learning sessions via webcam, so please ensure your internet connection is stable. It is a requirement of this course that ALL STUDENTS use their webcam and microphone during interactive sessions. Students that decline to use a webcam and microphone will not be considered eligible to continue the course. Webcam and microphone will be mandatory from week 3 onwards. A camera or smartphone will be required to take photos as evidence of practical tasks completed.

Course Cost

Course Fee for the full year for enrolled Faith Students: \$300

- Enrolled Faith Students \$300
- External Students \$1500
- Commercial Cost \$4000-\$5000

This cost is added to your School Fees. No additional costs are involved with this course, or additional equipment purchases are required.

This is a significant saving for our students. Outside of Faith, course fees start from \$1500 and can be as much as \$4000!

Note: This is not just about the cost. This course is specifically designed for school students, to fit in school times with appropriate tasks and examples, taught from a Christian worldview.

Course Outcome

This course is intended to provide participants with the following knowledge and skills to deepen their understanding of Christian theology and to perform limited functions associated with serving in a Christian church group or ministry context:

- Knowledge of theological sources
- Understanding of theological information
- Understanding of Christian practice
- Skills to identify theological insights
- Ability to communicate theology effectively

MANAGE ALL MODIFY



Students will be required to participate in at least 30 or more hours of work experience in a local church or parachurch ministry. This might include activities such as assisting or leading in children's, youth or young adult ministries, serving in church services providing support for church services including set-up/pack down, leading or assisting in small group lessons, administrative work in the office, sharing or preaching opportunities or other related ministry activities. Students can arrange this with their local church or community group. Work experience will be expected to begin week 1 of Term 2 and be completed by Week 10. Students may seek assistance from the RTO if a work placement is not possible. All activities will be overseen by a church leader who will meet with the student weekly to discuss their learning. An agreement with the organisation leadership and documentation will be provided for this placement.
